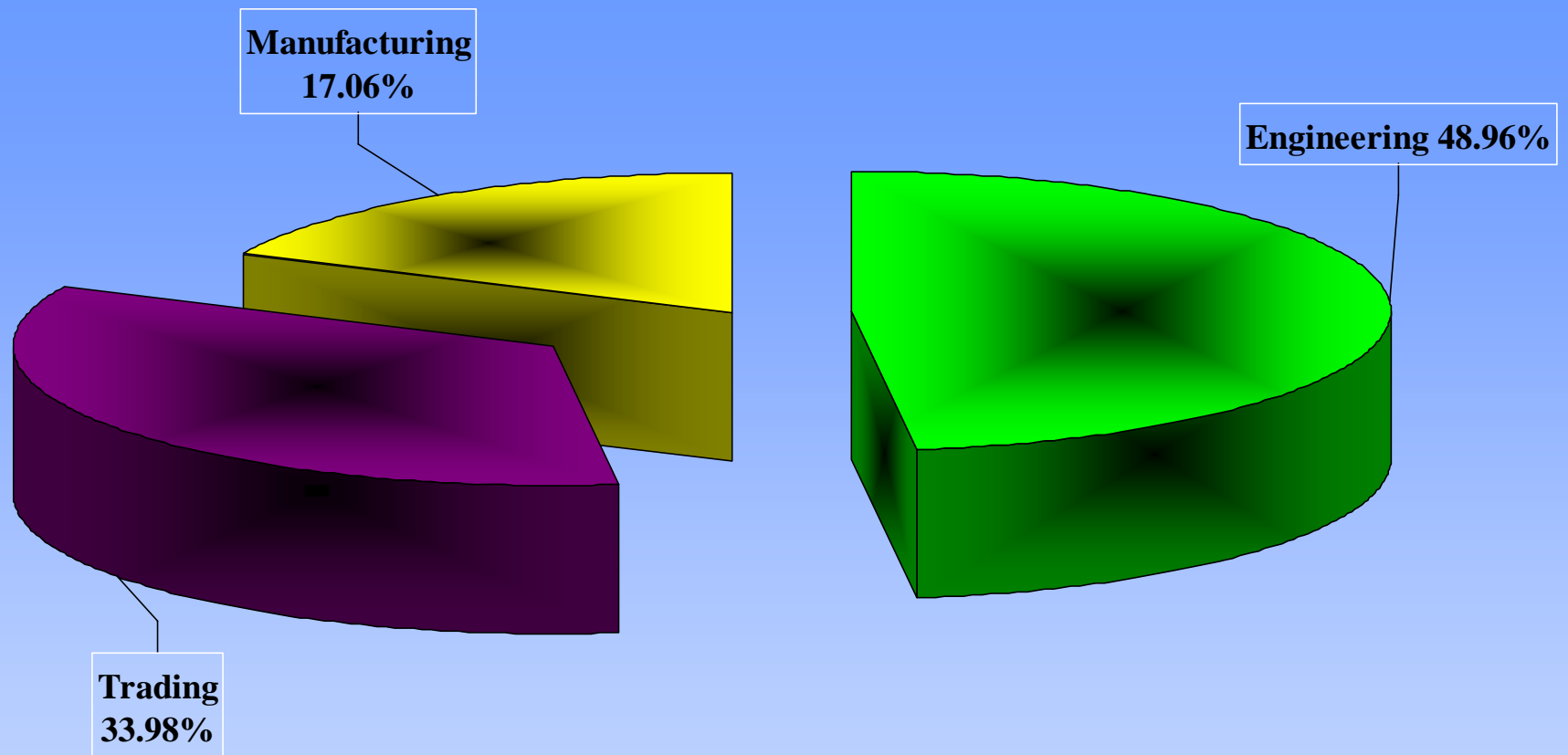

Direct Membership Classification

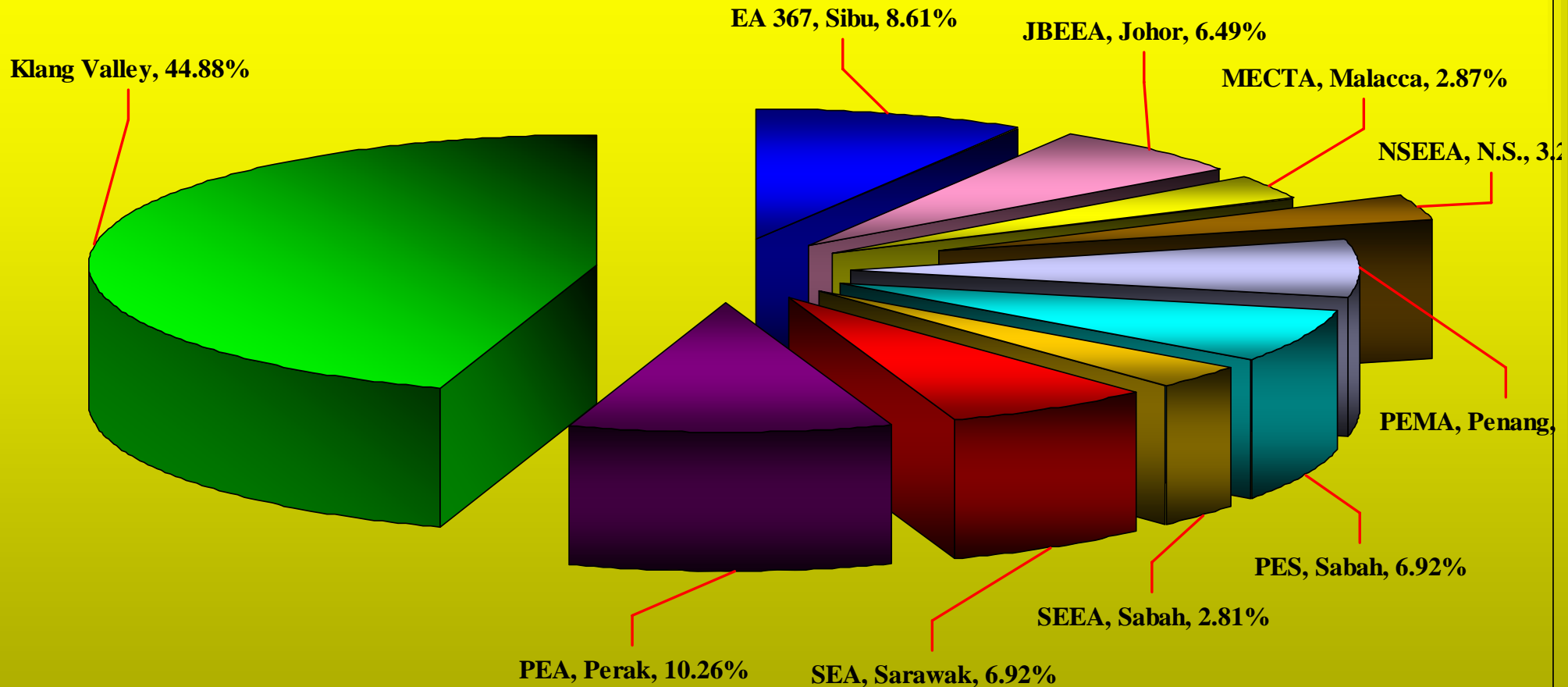

Diversified Markets Sustained Export Growth

- Global economic growth in 2007, estimated at 3.6 per cent by the World Bank, resulted in sustained global demand for imports, which positively impacted Malaysia's export performance.

10 Years of Trade Surplus

- In 2007, Malaysia recorded the tenth consecutive year of trade surplus. The trade surplus of RM 100.53 billion registered last year was the second highest ever recorded.
- Malaysia's total trade in 2007 continued on an upward trend, growing by 3.7 per cent to record RM 1.1097 trillion from RM 1.0697 trillion in 2006. This is the second year that Malaysia's total trade had surpassed the RM 1 trillion mark. Exports were valued at RM 605.1 billion, an increase of 2.7 per cent from 2006, while imports grew by 4.9 per cent to RM 504.57 billion.

- Export growth in 2007, emanated from both traditional and emerging markets, especially from countries such as China, Japan, Australia, Indonesia, the Netherlands, Germany, the United Arab Emirates (UAE), the Republic of Korea (ROK), Viet Nam, India and Pakistan. Collectively, **exports to these markets grew by 14.6 per cent, significantly higher than the 2.7 per cent increase in Malaysia's total exports.**

Expansion in exports to these growing markets was contributed by:

- **electrical and electronic products (E&E);**
- chemicals and chemical products;
- machinery, appliances and parts;
- iron and steel products;
- palm oil;
- and
- sawn timber and logs.

Major export destinations in Asia were:

- Singapore, with exports amounting to RM 88.51 billion;
- Japan – exports valued at RM 55.24 billion;
- China – RM 53.03 billion;
- Thailand – RM 29.98 billion;
- Hong Kong SAR – RM 27.97 billion;
- the ROK – RM 23.03 billion;
- and
- India – RM 20.2 billion.

- In 2007, Malaysia continued to be a leading supplier of E&E products to markets such as:
- **Singapore** – where Malaysia was the 2nd largest supplier;
- the **USA** – the 3rd largest supplier (based on US statistics for 11 months);
- **China** – the 6th largest supplier;
- **Japan** – the 6th largest supplier;
and
- **Hong Kong SAR** – the 5th largest supplier.

The contribution of E&E products to manufactured exports in 2007 is valued at RM 266.38 billion.
